- 1. Exhibitor form, Animal Entry form and Current W-9 (or Canadian) must be filled out and returned. Entries must include fees.
- 2. All entries must be made in accordance with general livestock terms and conditions. Please go to: www.MichiganStateFairLLC.com and enter online or mail to: MSFLLC, 46100 Grand River Ave., Novi, MI 48374 by August 1, 2019. There is a mandatory \$5.00 processing fee for all mail in entries. If you choose to enter via mail, the entry must be post marked (no metered mail) by the above stated deadlines. Make check or money order payable to the "Michigan State Fair LLC" or complete valid credit card information and signature.
- 3. All exhibitors, parents and trainers must comply with all rules that apply: General Fair Rules, and Horse Department Rules. Failure to comply to with any of the above rules may cause the loss of premiums and awards. This may also affect your eligibility to exhibit at future Fairs. SEE THE 4-H HORSE AND PONY SHOW RULES REGULATIONS BOOKLET, PUBLISHED BY MICHIGAN STATE EXTENSION, AVAILABLE AT YOUR 4-H OFFICE, FAIR OFFICE OR MSU WEB SITE:

- Exhibitors must be nine years old as of January 1st of the current year to show a horse at Fair
- All animals must be under the control of the exhibitor and the exhibitor must show awareness of correct procedures to show the animal. In the interest of safety, the superintendent shall have any uncontrollable animal removed. At no time during at the Fair, shall any animal be maintained on tranquilizers.
- Any equine with clinical signs of infections, contagious or toxicological disease, or not in desirable show condition shall be removed from the Fair. This shall be determined by the Superintendent. All horses must show a negative coggins test within the past twelve months.
- 7. WARNING: Under the Michigan Equine Liability Act (1994 P.A. 351), an equine professional is not liable for an injury to or the death of a participant in an equine activity resulting from an inherent risk of the equine activity.
- All animals 56 inches and under must be shown in the Pony classes. All ponies will be measured upon arrival to Fair or show official pony card
- No lunging in any arenas when there are riders present.

- 10. No loose horses are to be turned out in any arena at any
- 11. Exhibitors must provide bedding for their horses/ponies. Straw or wood shavings are permitted.
- 12. Classes will be judged according to the current 4-H Horse and Pony Project/Show Rules and Regulations.
- 13. Exhibitors showing in Walk-Trot classes are not allowed to show in any three gaited classes. Any exhibitor showing in any three gaited class may not show in any walk-trot class.
- 14. All horses/ponies must be fully tacked with saddle and bridle when ridden on the Fairgrounds with the exceptions of classes with specific appointments (i.e. Bareback). Multiple riders are not permitted.
- 15. An entrant must have entered, shown and been judged in a class in that class type to be eligible to enter the Championship classes.
- 16. Class will be divided if the class size is over 20 riders. Further class splits may occur in the interest of safety to our exhibitors at the discretion of the superintendent and/or judge. Show management reserves the right to combine
- 17. All participants in gymkhana classes and practices are required to wear protective riding helmets. The helmets must meet the specifications of the American Society for Testing and Materials (ASTM), must be manufactured and distributed by a participant in the certification program of the Safety Equipment Institute (SEI) and must bear the SEI certification label. It is highly recommended that all 4-H members participating in horse shows and practice events wear protective headgear.
- 18. Stallions allowed with handler/rider 19 and over.
