RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE SHOW - OPEN & YOUTH

*** Please check and follow General Agriculture & Livestock Rules ***

- 1. All goats must be identified by registered breed tattoo accompanied by breed registration papers. All registration papers must match the tattoo of the animal.
- 2. A Youth Exhibitor must be seven (7) years of age, but not over twenty (20) years of age as of January 1 of the current year to participate in any youth animal class. For classes under the Youth Educational or Demonstration categories exhibitors are limited to youth who are nine (9) years of age but not over nineteen (19) years of age as of December 31 of current year. Date of birth must be on entry form. Open Exhibitor must be seven (7) years of age unless otherwise stated.
- 3. Exhibitor form and Current W-9 (W-8 Canadian) must be filled out and returned. Entries must include fees.

- 4. **OWNER IS THE EXHIBITOR**. All entries must be made as the papers read. No signed transfers. Exhibitor must have ownership by July 1 of the current year. Limit of 25 head per farm or address.
 - a) All registration papers must match the tattoos of the animal(s).
 - b) Tampering and/or misrepresentation as to breeding, ownership and any other irregularity in showing will be considered fraud and deception. Any premiums, trophies or awards won by such exhibitor will be withheld.
- 5. Entries must be made on proper entry forms. Youth exhibitor's must complete Youth section of entry form and submit all Youth fees. Animals must be in Youth's (the exhibitor) name. All goats <u>must have</u> registration papers. Registration papers should be presented at time of check-in. Youth's name must be printed on the registration papers. Youth exhibitors entering Open classes must complete Open section and pay open fees.
- 6. All entries must be made in accordance with general livestock terms and conditions. Please go to: www.MichiganStateFairLLC.com and enter online or mail to: MSFLLC, 46100 Grand River Ave., Novi, MI 48374, by August 1, 2019. There is a mandatory \$5.00 processing fee for all mail in entries. LATE ENTRIES AFTER AUGUST 1, 2019. Online entries ONLY due by August 5th, 2019, without penalty.
- 7. If you choose to enter via mail, the entry must be post marked (no metered mail) by the above stated deadlines. Make check or money order payable to the "Michigan State Fair LLC" or complete valid credit card information and signature.
- 8. The base date for computing the age of goats shall be the day the animal is judged.
- 9. No bucks allowed on fairgrounds.
- 10. An exhibitor may show a maximum of two (2) animals per class and one (1) entry per group class. In the Best Udder and Best Home Bred classes an exhibitor may only enter one (1) animal.
- 11. An exhibitor may substitute an animal within the same class as entered at no charge. The exhibitor will be charged a fee of \$5.00 to substitute an animal into a different class.
- 12. The floor in the livestock area is polished concrete. For the safety of the animals and exhibitors, exhibitors are responsible for providing suitable floor coverings in their stalls/pens. Examples of coverings may be: roofing paper, carpet, plywood, deep bedding, rubber mats or other suitable material to prevent animals from the risk of injury. Aisles will have rolled roofing or other covering on them for movement to and from the rings, etc.
- 13. Aisles are to be clean and swept the entire time the fair is open to the public.
- 14. A goat with contagious disease will not be allowed to pen or show.
- 15. Each youth exhibitor will be permitted to enter a maximum of ten (10) goats and show a maximum of two (2) per class, except in championships.
- 16. Youth exhibitors in this department are expected to observe the following dress regulations: White shirts or blouses with white, black, or khaki pants or skirts. Shorts are not proper attire for Goat exhibitors all will not be allowed in the ring.
- 17. Open & Youth All Breeds, all does 2 years and older must have freshened.
- 18. Entries may be limited according to available pen space. Pen space will be assigned based on the number of animals that you bring to exhibit.

EXPLANATION OF TERMS

- 1. Produce-of-Dam consists of two does, produce of one dam. Produce all need not be owned by the exhibitor. Entries in this class shall be made in the name of the dam. In the Produce-of-Dam at least one of the animals shown must be owned by the exhibitor.
- 2. Only animals exhibited in open individual classes are eligible to show in group classes.
- 3. Junior Champion Class shall consist of all first & second place winners in the first (4) four classes. Senior Champion Class shall consist of all first place winners in the next five classes, or does under 2, in milk and older animals.
- 4. Senior Champion and Junior Champion and Reserve animals shall compete for Grand Champion & Reserve Grand Champion.
- 5. Challenge Doe Class Permanent Champion Dairy Doe who has received a permanent ADGA Championship. Permanent champions may be shown in the regular or the challenge class, whichever the owner chooses.

6. Premier Exhibitor. The exhibitor winning the most points from placings for their top six animals in the open single classes, exhibited by himself/herself shall be designated the Premier Exhibitor. Families/Farms cannot combine animals to receive this award. The point system for determining Premier Exhibitor is as follows:
