Multi-instrumentalists Katie Larson and Sav Buist are creating quite an enormous buzz among music lovers of all genres, all over the world. Described as "a duo giving an edge to folk with unique instrumentation, "Displaying a genre-hopping range of influences and some smart songwriting skills to go with their abundant musical chops." — Billboard Magazine

They met in 2011 at their public high school in northern Michigan. Katie was a freshman cello player, "playing up" in the Philharmonic Orchestra and Savannah was Concert Master, violinist. They volunteered for a class assignment that threw them together for their first rehearsal and The Accidentals were born. Northville native Michael Dause joined the band as drummer in 2014.

Growing up in musical families with professional pianists for fathers and vocalist for mothers, their influences bounced between classical, jazz, bluegrass, country, alt-rock, and the obscure. Their collective playlist you just won't find on mainstream radio. They are "explorers and admirers" of indie music greats like Andrew Bird, St. Vincent, Sufjan Stevens, Arcade Fire, Yeah Yeah Yeahs, Black Keys, Sarah Jaffe –as well as the Beatles. Their original tunes reflect their exposure to a wide variety of instruments while staying true to their orchestral roots. In addition to the tight harmonies, guitar, bass, glockenspiel, mandolin, banjo, piano, organ, accordion, and kazoo...you simply can't miss the edgy violin and cello that defines this duo.

The third annual **State Fair Superstar Contest** anchors live musical entertainment at the Fair, presented by **Pepsi-Cola**! This wildly popular feature of the Fair debuted in 2014, and has launched new EPs for 2014 Grand Prize Winner **Alison Albrecht** of Birmingham and 2015 Winner **Carly Bins** of Northville. The Superstar contest offers a purely Michigan mentoring twist on the standard pop music talent contest formula, with songwriting advice plus artist and repertoire coaching from award-winning artist/producer **Nadir Omowale**, live performance booking consultation from **2 Stones Events**, and production of a three song EP at world famous **Pearl Sound Studios** of Canton, with internationally renowned sound engineer and producer **Chuck Alkazian**, in addition to a cash prize and Indie Music Business Coaching from Music Mentor **Jill Jack** and her new enterprise, **Dream Big, Inc**. Fourteen finalists will perform on the Main Stage Thursday evening September 1 and Friday September 2, with finals Saturday evening September 3, Grand Prize Winner, Runner-Up and Honorable Mention headline the main stage at the State Fair on Sunday evening September 4.

The original Michigan State Fair, which debuted in Detroit in 1849, was one of the first statewide fair events to take place in the United States. It moved permanently to its home at the Michigan State Fairgrounds on Woodward Avenue in 1905 and was staged there until 2009, when it was discontinued by a resolution of the state government, due to ongoing budget issues. The Michigan State Fair, LLC is now being produced as a private enterprise, and presented for the fourth year with title sponsor Fifth Third Bank.
